Prior to his kingdom assignment at Tabernacle, he shepherded the Pleasant View Missionary Baptist Church in Salem, Alabama for three and a half years.

Dr. Goodman received his undergraduate degree from Wake Forest University in Winston Salem, NC, with honors. He earned a Master of Divinity degree from Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta, Ga and his Doctor of Ministry from Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC. An avid learner and pupil of excellence, he also earned a Master of Management with a concentration in Organizational Leadership from Cambridge College and is a practitioner of the Clergy Scholars Program hosted by Yale University. He serves on many community boards and as an adjunct professor/mentor at institutions of higher learning. He is also a content contributor to many ministry publications concerning ministry methodologies and contemporary preaching.

Dr. Goodman has preached and studied in the Holy Land. He has authored 4 books: You Can't Run from Purpose, Road to Recovery, The Flip Side of Favor and It's Complicated

A native of Greensboro, NC, Pastor Goodman comes from a faith-built foundation demonstrated to him by his grandparents, Deacon Ernest and Mrs. Charlotte Swann, who raised him.
