Stephen Ministry: Trained Caregiver

“My dad has Alzheimer’s and I recently arranged a Zoom call with two of my brothers in Pennsylvania so they could see him face to face. They had a great conversation, and although daddy didn’t remember their names at first, he knew they were his sons.

As the call ended, one brother expressed relief as he had been emotionally preparing for the possibility that our dad wouldn’t recognize him at all. I started to interrupt him with my own observations, but instead I chose to listen. He then shared an experience from last year when our dad had flatly denied having another one of my brothers as a son. So my brother had joined this call expecting the same outcome.

By trusting the Holy Spirit and listening, I was able to hear his deeper fear. While that fear may one day materialize, we are both better equipped to understand it’s the progression of the disease and not a father rejecting his son. In that moment, I clearly saw how God has used Stephen Ministry to equip me to walk compassionately with others. These Christ-centered “life skills” are a gift, strengthening not only care receivers, but every relationship God entrusts to us.” ~*Gia Hunter*~
